## ENGO – Statement 11.0 Infrastructure

  - ... vulnerable and sensitive water areas must be identified ... interim protection imposed ...

## IC Recommendations - Summary

- Sustainable, fair, practical are terms used in guiding principles however there is not a recommendation to identify economic costs and benefits of source water protection.
